18th Annual FRNNG Parade and McRae Park Family Fun Day June 2

It's time for some summer fun! Join us for the FRNNG 18th Annual Parade and McRae Park Family Fun Day—it is the perfect opportunity to welcome the sunshine, connect with neighbors and friends, and take advantage of all that the celebration has to offer! The parade will start at 10:15 am at the corner of 44th and Oakland. It will proceed south on Oakland, turn east on 47th St., and then south onto Chicago Ave. Finally, the Parade will turn on 49th and travel north back up Elliot Ave. to McRae Park, where the Family Fun Day festivities will await. The celebration at McRae Park will start immediately following the Parade and will run until 3 pm.

Some highlights of this year's event are the Washburn High School Jazz Band, Ms. Mason's Choral group from the Ramsey International Fine Arts School, Jessica Lee Ensemble Music, McRae Ballet dancers, an International Soccer Club demo, Rick Faye's Kali Group, a demonstration by the Minneapolis Police K-9 Unit, the McRae

Jazz Band, the Minneapolis Fire Department, a Book Fair and tons of fabulous food! There are two especially exciting additions to this year's Parade and Fun Day. The FRNNG Energy Challenge Group will be

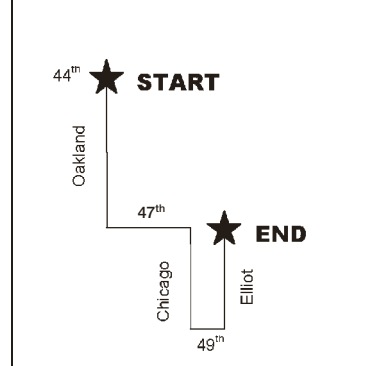

Dear Friends and Neighbors – thank you for this opportunity to update you on Minneapolis issues and City Hall news.


Construction Starts on Crosstown Commons

After major delays and funding difficulties, a contractor has been awarded the bid for the Crosstown Commons construction project and work will begin this summer. The Crosstown Commons reconstruction will be phased over three years, with work starting this year in the area of the Diamond Lake Bridge. An Informational Meeting, sponsored by MnDOT, will be held from 4:30-8 pm, Thursday, May 24th, at Richfield Lutheran Church, 8 W. 60th St., Mpls. (the corner of 60th St. and Nicollet Ave.). MnDOT's informational website for the Crosstown Commons is:

www.dot.state.mn.us/projects/crosstown. The MnDOT website includes a general construction schedule for the project.

Bus Rapid Transit Station

One of the conditions for Minneapolis' consent to the Crosstown Commons was creating more transit opportunities for residents through Bus Rapid Transit (BRT), a dedicated bus service on I-35W from Lakeville to downtown Minneapolis. The first



transit station will be built at the 46th St. Bridge over I-35W, with construction starting in 2008 or 2009. A group of transit-using residents from the surrounding neighborhoods, including FRNNG, has been meeting with Metro Transit officials to discuss the station and how it may impact our neighborhoods and existing bus service.

Implement BRT Now!

Unfortunately, MnDOT does not yet have a plan that will allow BRT to be implemented north of 46th St. Currently it is estimated that BRT may not be fully implemented until sometime between 2023-2030. I have been working with our state legislators to find solutions, including a request that MnDOT conduct a feasibility study for implementing BRT in conjunction with the Crosstown Commons. We need solutions that will reduce congestion and increase transit on I-35W now, not in 2030!

Children are accepted regardless of race, gender, religion, national origin or relationship to a Shriner. 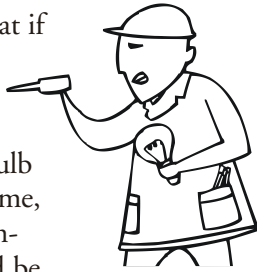

Recent Events at Northrop Urban Environmental Learning Center

On April 17th families attended Family Math and Science Night, an event where they could do math and science activities together in a fun, no pressure environment. Family Math and Family Science nights are held throughout the country. Activities were set up at different stations, and large group sessions proved very popular. The large group activities included a math game called Double Digit and a science challenge called Chute, in which families use recycled materials to create elaborate chutes for marbles.

On April 20th Northrop students celebrated Earth Day by visiting the Minnesota Zoo and the adjacent School for Environmental Studies (SES). High school students from SES annually host this event, which has become a Northrop tradition. The high school students lead environmental education activities and give students a tour of the zoo.

Wireless Broadband Project Update

The City's WiFi project has been out of the news



recently, but that doesn't mean the project has slowed down. Construction of the network is currently underway in Downtown and it will move into SW Minneapolis in May. We expect all 59 square miles of the city to be covered by a wireless broadband network by November of this year. Residents will be able to sign up for wireless accounts with US Internet that will provide wireless access anywhere in Minneapolis. For residents, this access will cost \$19.95 a month.

The City also signed a groundbreaking community benefits agreement (CBA) with US Internet. They will contribute millions of dollars to fund digital inclusion programs designed to promote Internet access and improved computer literacy to bridge the digital divide. The CBA also includes exciting provisions for free limited-time access at parks and public places as well as a free "walled garden" for important neighborhood, government, and community services information, something like the public access reserved for citizen use of television.

T-ball Program and Youth Football Camp at McRae Park

McRae Area Recreational Council (MARC) and Kidspeed have partnered to provide a fundamental T-ball program at McRae Park. The program began in May and is geared toward 3-6 year old kids. Kidspeed has developed a series of obstacle courses and drills that assist players in learning the fundamentals of hitting, catching, throwing, base running, and teamwork. Kidspeed was developed by InnerCity Tennis to help children build confidence and self-esteem.
