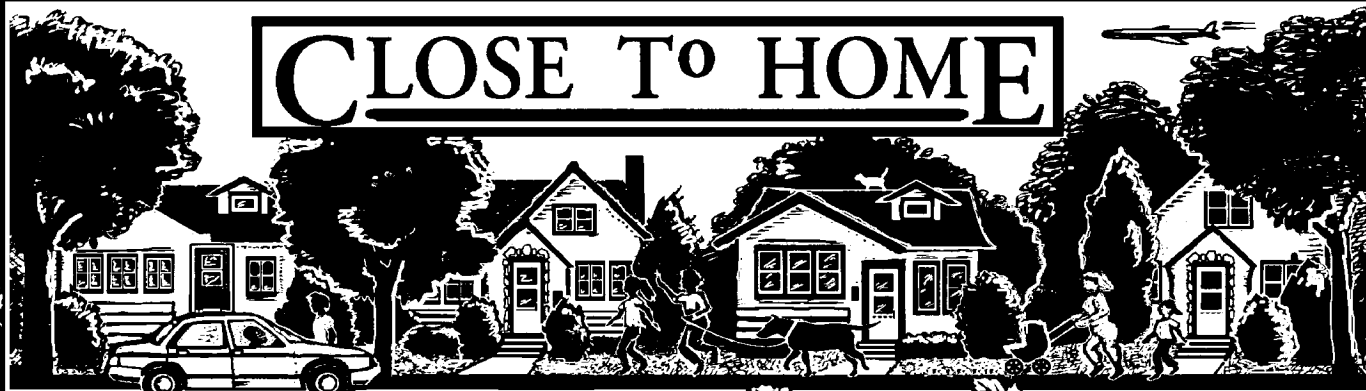

Northrop School Update

At the August 8 meeting of the Minneapolis Board of Education it was unanimously agreed to reject the proposal from The City, Inc. to use the former Northrop Elementary building for its programs. The Superintendent offered the following recommendation to the School Board prior to the vote. Many of the concerns outlined in Dr. Green's recommendation were reiterated by School Board members as rationales for their vote against The City, Inc. proposal.

"[It is my recommendation that] the Board of Education, Special School District No. 1, not begin negotiations with The City, Inc. for the following reasons: The facility is designed primarily for the purpose of educating elementary students. Therefore, the learning environment would not be conducive to assure students meet the high standards for learning as required by the state, particularly in science. In addition the majority of the students rely on metro transit for transportation to and from school. Northrop's site is not conveniently located to a metro bus stop." He additionally stated that "the neighborhood residents felt strongly that the program and age level of students were not a good fit."

Thank you to all who helped the School Board come to this decision with your letters, phone calls, emails and

personal contacts with the School Board. It was great to see the community come together in a collective manner to accomplish a victory for the neighborhood. Additionally, the community will be pleased to know, The City, Inc. has found a more appropriate building for their needs and will be using Wilder School for the upcoming school year.

Going forward, new tenants will be considered for Northrop under the following guidelines presented by Superintendent Green: "The facility reuse planning process will continue to be guided by the following goal: providing occupancies that enhance neighborhoods and provide the highest possible benefit to the children, families, and the neighborhoods of Minneapolis Public Schools."

8th Ward News

Fall greetings and welcome back to school! I appreciate this opportunity to update you on City and 8th Ward issues.

On Friday, September 1, 2006, the City Council selected US Internet, a local Twin Cities company, as the vendor to make wireless (WI-FI) services available to residents throughout the city limits. This is the first city contract that has included a Community Benefits Agreement, the terms of which were developed by a diverse group of community residents and representatives from government, labor, and non-profit institutions. The City of Minneapolis is an "anchor tenant" on this network and the services it is purchasing will enhance the existing work of our police, inspections, public works, and more. Residents will be able to purchase services from US Internet or from competitors on the network.

The City will pay 2.2 million as a partial up-front payment for services, which will be credited against all future payments for the life of the 10-year contract. This includes credit for the time value of money (the potential for interest earned on this upfront payment) in the

amount of \$978,000. The city's payments for service to US Internet will not exceed payments departments now make for existing services (such as cell-phones and other data and voice services). Community benefits include payment of \$500,000 to establish a digital inclusion fund, managed by community members, and 90 community log-in sites with access to much public information, called "walled gardens".

Starting this September, I'm pleased to announce *Early Mornings with Elizabeth*, a monthly community roundtable for residents that will take place the last Friday of every month, 7:30 – 9 am. The host site for *Early Mornings* is Turtle Bread, at 48th & Chicago. Our first meeting will be September 29th with guest speakers Dr. Bill Green, Minneapolis Superintendent of Schools, and Mayor RT Rybak. Halloween Safety Tips

Everyone wants to have a safe and happy Halloween for themselves, their guests and their children. Using safety tips and common sense can help you make the most of your Halloween season and make it as enjoyable for your kids as it is for you!

What follows are some tips for parents and kids to help you make the most of a holiday enjoyed by many ... HALLOWEEN!

Know the route your kids will be taking if you aren't going with them. If you can't take them, see if another parent or a teen-aged sibling can go along.

Know what other activities a child may be attending, such as parties, school or mall functions.

Make sure you set a time that they should be home by.

Explain to children the difference between tricks and vandalism.

Explain to your kids that animal cruelty is not acceptable.

Help your child pick out or make a costume that will be safe. Make it fire proof and the eye holes should be large enough for good peripheral vision.

If you set jack-o-lanterns on your porch with candles in them, make sure that they are far enough out of the way so that kids' costumes won't accidentally be set on fire.

Make sure that if your child is carrying a prop it is smooth and flexible enough to not cause injury if fallen on.

There are many pumpkin carving kits available that come with tiny saws that work better than knives and are safer. It's best to let the kids clean out the pumpkin and draw a face on it, which you can carve for them.

US Internet Approved as Wireless Minneapolis Vendor

The Minneapolis City Council has approved US Internet as the vendor to build and manage a citywide wireless network that will allow the City to provide better services to people who live, work, and play in Minneapolis. The Council approved the selection at its regular meeting on Sept. 1, 2006.

A contract negotiations team, made up of City staff, elected officials, and community and tech experts recommended the City choose US Internet as the wireless vendor, after a selection process that began with more than 80 companies who expressed interest in working with the City. The agreement with US Internet also includes a strong set of community benefits that were negotiated after receiving public input during dozens of community meetings and round tables.

City staff members are working to finalize the contract with US Internet. Construction of the network, which will cover all 54 square miles of the city, will begin this fall and is expected to take about a year. 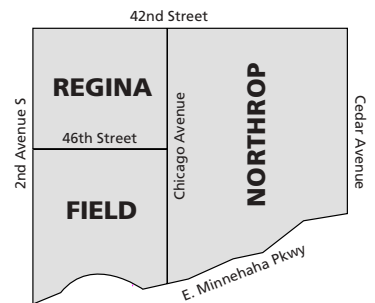
